<p>Description: Water conservation has become a key priority for many municipalities throughout the United States. It has been estimated that approximately 30-50% of potable municipal water is used for residential landscape irrigation. While homeowners have traditionally installed and appreciated landscapes comprised predominantly of turfgrass, many communities are now enacting rebate programs incentivizing removal of turfgrass and conversion to alternative landscapes, with the goal of reducing outdoor water use. However, most prior research evaluating alternative landscape benefits have focused primarily on water use, with little emphasis on other important considerations associated with this type of landscape conversion. The objectives of this study were to compare four alternative water-efficient landscapes (mulch, xeriscaping, artificial turf, and sand-capped lawn) with traditional St. Augustinegrass home lawns in terms of ecosystem services and environmental impacts including rainfall capture, runoff dynamics, runoff chemistry, surface temperatures, and weed pressure. Our results revealed that while the traditional lawn requires more supplemental irrigation, it offers ecosystem services including rainfall capture, runoff reduction, and temperature moderation compared to other landscape types.</p>
